LUKE A. BRONIN

Doctor of Laws

As an attorney, politician, and veteran, you have devoted your career to service to others and have established yourself as a fierce advocate for the greater good. When elected as the 67th mayor of Hartford in 2016, you made a promise to build a stronger city for all residents through a vision of optimism, collaboration, and true grit. You delivered on that promise, and we—the City of Hartford and Trinity College—are among the beneficiaries.

Your distinguished career is supported by your impressive academic credentials. You earned a B.A. from Yale University and an M.Sc. from the University of Oxford, where you studied as a Rhodes Scholar. You then returned to the United States and earned a J.D. from Yale Law School.

In 2007, you became a commissioned officer in the U.S. Navy Reserve and later served as a member of the military's anti-corruption task force during your deployment to Afghanistan in 2010. You also were a member of President Barack Obama's administration, serving in appointed positions at the U.S. Department of the Treasury. You served as senior adviser to the deputy secretary and then were appointed deputy assistant secretary for the Office of Terrorist Financing and Financial Crimes. In that role, you helped lead federal government efforts to isolate and disrupt international terrorist groups and advanced U.S. national security and foreign policy interests.

In 2013, Connecticut Governor Dannel Malloy asked you to serve as his general counsel, launching your extraordinary service of more than a decade to the state and its capital city. You became deeply involved in developing policies to combat veterans' homelessness, to expand economic opportunities, to reform the criminal justice system, and to protect the environment. In 2015, after you spent a year as partner at the law firm of Hinckley Allen, the residents of Hartford elected you their mayor.

You chose to lead with care and with unwavering determination. After taking office in 2016, you guided the city through one of its biggest fiscal crises ever and put it on a path to fiscal stability while vigorously promoting economic development. In addition to leading the city through the COVID-19 pandemic, you built opportunities for Hartford residents through key initiatives, including the Youth Service Corps and the Reentry Welcome Center. Most importantly, you reestablished a relationship of trust and confidence between the city government and its people. And today, following your leadership, Hartford is positioned as a center of innovation and a leader in environmental stewardship.

As mayor, you maintained a visible presence in every corner of Hartford, listening, engaging, and acting. Indeed, you also prioritized Trinity as one of the city's great treasures. For 200 years, the College has been both in and of Hartford, and today, after your eight-year run as mayor, the relationship between the City of Hartford and Trinity is as strong and fruitful as ever.

During your administration, Trinity extended itself beyond its academic borders in new and creative ways to help drive growth within the city and to support the student experience. In 2018, Trinity announced a pathbreaking partnership with the Hartford-based global technology giant Infosys, and in 2020, the College opened the 13,000-square-foot Trinity Innovation Center in downtown Hartford. We improved our social and civic responsibility throughout the community as you showed no limits in advancing the well-being and safety of the neighborhoods that surround the College. Your belief in our liberal arts institution strengthened our footing in Hartford as Trinity enters its third century of excellence.

In recognition of your determined spirit, profound influence in service to Hartford and our nation, and the care with which you led, I have the honor of presenting you, Luke A. Bronin, for the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*.

SARA C. BRONIN

Doctor of Laws

It is through your passion for preservation—and its power to connect us with our past and to give us a sense of continuity, identity, and belonging—that you have become one of our country’s leading voices and preeminent authorities on historic preservation law. You are a proud Mexican-American architect, attorney, policymaker, and professor, and your interdisciplinary research focuses on how law and policy can foster more equitable, sustainable, well-designed, and connected places.

Your history of transformative impact in and exemplary knowledge of the specialty areas of housing, sustainability, historic preservation law, land-use law, renewable energy law, and transportation law is clear. Nominated by President Joe Biden, you were confirmed by unanimous consent of the U.S. Senate in December 2022 to serve as the 12th chair of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, where you lead the preservation, enhancement, and sustainable use of our nation’s diverse historic resources and advise the president and Congress on national historic preservation policy.

Prior to your confirmation, you spent your career as a professor and public servant. As an academic, you are a professor of the Cornell University College of Architecture, Art, and Planning and director of the Legal Constructs Lab, an associate member of the faculty of Cornell Law School, and a faculty fellow of the Cornell Atkinson Center for Sustainability.

As a public servant and preservationist, you have said historic, tribal, and cultural resources allow us to better understand our past so we may shape a brighter future for our communities. For this reason, you believe deeply in the importance of engaging in debates about energy policy, climate resilience, housing development, transportation infrastructure, tribal sovereignty, and the tax system to help inform decision-making.

One doesn’t need to travel far to bear witness to your influence. Your work serving on the City of Hartford Planning and Zoning Commission led to the capital city’s nationally recognized, award-winning efforts to draft and adopt a climate action plan, city plan, and zoning-code overhaul. You built consensus within the city for how environmental sustainability goes hand in hand with responsible placemaking, allowing Hartford to become a city for others across the country to emulate.

Your influence extends beyond the classroom, boardroom, and courtroom. You’ve published five books and treatises and dozens of articles, book chapters, and shorter works on your areas of expertise. You founded the National Zoning Atlas, designed to translate and standardize information about how zoning regulates housing in approximately 30,000 U.S. jurisdictions. In 2020, you also founded Desegregate CT, a pro-homes coalition of neighbors and nonprofits advocating for better local and state land-use policies to make every community in Connecticut more prosperous, equitable, and sustainable. You also have served as chair of Preservation Connecticut, an adviser to the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and a board member of Latinos in Heritage Conservation.

You earned a B.Arch. and B.A. from the University of Texas and an M.Sc. from the University of Oxford, where you studied as a Rhodes Scholar. You went on to earn a J.D. from Yale Law School, where you were the senior editor of the *Yale Law & Policy Review* and clerked for then-Judge Sonia Sotomayor on the Second Circuit Court of Appeals.

From the early days of your career to your most recent appointment, your inspiring work here in Hartford and across the country continues to connect us in more equitable and sustainable ways.

In recognition of your enormous contributions to the greater good as a public servant, academician, and attorney, I have the honor of presenting you, Sara C. Bronin, for the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*.

DANNY MEYER
Trinity Class of 1980
Doctor of Humane Letters

Born and raised in St. Louis, Missouri, you grew up in a family that relished great food, travel, and hospitality. Yet, when mapping your strategy for your undergraduate education at Trinity College, a career in hospitality was far from being on your radar. A 2012 story about you in *The Trinity Reporter* recounts your interest in contemplating a career in government, which led you to major in political science. It told the tale of how your experiences and passions shifted 'neath the elms and how you believed that Trinity gave you a chance to explore yourself and to start defining success on your own terms. Five years after graduating from Trinity, you met with that success.

It was in 1985 at the age of 27 that you opened your first restaurant, Union Square Cafe in New York City, with hospitality at the heart of your mission as a curious, emerging restaurateur with an unquenchable thirst for learning. Nearly 40 years later, you have parlayed the experience of opening that first restaurant into becoming an internationally recognized, award-winning leader in your field as the founder of Union Square Hospitality Group (USHG).

For four decades, you've pioneered a new era of experiences for your guests, community, suppliers, and investors. Responsible for some of New York's most beloved, popular, and acclaimed restaurants, including Gramercy Tavern and The Modern, you also founded Shake Shack, the modern-day "roadside" burger restaurant with more than 500 locations around the world. Under your leadership, USHG has become renowned for its distinctive and celebrated culture of enlightened hospitality. More recently, you've expanded service to include dining options in museums, sports arenas, and cultural institutions, and you have made visionary investments in blossoming neighborhoods.

Remarkably, you continue to find new ways to serve others by extending your enterprise beyond the walls of your eateries. You have used 40 years of learning, experience, and skill to teach others how to uncover the power of hospitality through innovative consulting, acquisitions, and even investment strategies. Your groundbreaking business book, *Setting the Table*, a *New York Times* bestseller, shares a set of signature business and life principles that translate to a wide range of industries.

You have been recognized for your leadership, achievements, and humanitarianism, including receiving the 2017 Julia Child Award and the 2012 Aspen Institute Preston Robert Tisch Award in Civic Leadership and being named to the 2015 *TIME* "100 Most Influential People" list. You, your restaurants, and your chefs have earned an unprecedented 28 James Beard Awards.

You have served on several boards and committees, including those for Share Our Strength and Madison Square Park Conservancy. In 2021, then-New York Mayor Bill de Blasio named you chair of the Board of Directors of the New York City Economic Development Corporation to help bolster the city's business pandemic recovery.

Trinity has recognized you for giving much of your time, talent, and treasure to your alma mater, including your service on the Board of Trustees. In 1999, you received a 175th Anniversary Award, and in 2000, you were honored with the Gary McQuaid Award. In 2018, you were included on Trinity's Wall of Honor, which recognizes those whose philanthropy has had a profound impact at the College.

In recognition of your investment in and dedication to hospitality and to serving others, your community, and the College, I have the honor of presenting you, Danny Meyer, for the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

The Academic Regalia

In 1895, a commission of leading American educators established the Intercollegiate Code pertaining to the academic costume. The color of the lining of the hood is that of the college or university conferring the degree. The edging of the hood and the tassel of the cap indicate the subject to which the degree pertains, in accordance with the following official designations for colleges and universities in the United States:

The Owen Morgan Mace

The mace, which precedes the president in academic processions and is a symbol of executive powers, was presented to Trinity in 1950 in memory of Owen Morgan, Class of 1906, who served his alma mater as a member of the Board of Fellows, as a trustee, and as treasurer of the College. Historically, maces were first used as weapons in warfare and later became a symbol of the sovereign and his power. One of the first known uses of a mace by an educational institution was at Cambridge University in the 13th century. Today a number of colleges use the mace as a symbol of authority and of the power invested in the president by the faculty and trustees. The Morgan Mace is made of ebony, signifying endurance; bronze, meaning power; and gold, symbolizing dignity and glory. It is 44 inches long and weighs 20 pounds. The fluted staff represents the various components of an enduring education. It is bound by a gold ribbon, inscribed with the names of every Trinity president. On the head, or urn, of the mace are six seals of the sources of life and growth of this College: the Great Seal of the United States; the Seal of the State of Connecticut; the Charter Oak; the original seal of the City of Hartford; the Washington Coat of Arms; and the seal of the Episcopal Diocese of Connecticut. Surmounting the Gothic urn is the Trinity College seal crowned by an eagle about to take flight, symbolizing the freedom and power of an educated person.

The Presidential Collar

The collar, which is worn on ceremonial occasions, is the visible symbol of the president's high office and authority. The collar was presented to the College in 1953 by former President G. Keith Funston, Class of 1932, in memory of his grandmother, Maria Briggs Keith. The chain symbolically links modern higher education with the universities of yesteryear. The golden seal of the Trinity president hangs from the collar, which is fashioned of 20 replicas of the Trinity elms and seven silver seals: the six reproduced in the mace and the Trinity College seal superimposed on a triangle representing the religious foundations of the College crowned by a sun signifying enlightenment. In the lower corners of the triangle are the Book and a pair of student's hands extended to receive it, symbolizing the desire of youth to receive an education.

The Luther-Roosevelt Long Walk Inscription

The inscription on a stone in front of the Fuller Arch at Northam Towers commemorates the visit in June 1918 of former U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt, who delivered an address the day before Commencement and received an honorary degree at the ceremony.

The superstition holds that students who step on the stone may not graduate.

As the Commencement procession passes over the stone every year, graduating seniors make a point of deliberately stepping on it.

Taking the theme of his address from Old Testament scripture, Roosevelt commented on the emptiness of boasting and its prejudicial effect on the conduct of World War I. He cited a passage from 1 Kings 20:11, in which the King of Israel responds to a boasting warrior, “Let not him that girdeth on his harness boast himself as he that putteth it off.” The passage’s Latin translation is inscribed in the stone. Roosevelt indicated that, in his estimation, thoughtless exaggeration of Americans’ might had reinforced the German will to pursue the war. He reminded the approximately 5,000 people in the audience that much work remained to be done and that the country had to gear itself up for the supreme effort. Less than a month later, Roosevelt’s youngest son, Quentin, was shot down in aerial combat in France.
