Motivations

- Artists record the work in progress (WIP) of their art projects but there does not exist an application for this purpose
- Existing platforms to upload art like DeviantArt are too focused on the end goal rather than the process of making art
- Artists usually store their WIP in their phone photo album, which is mixed up with other photos

Project Overview

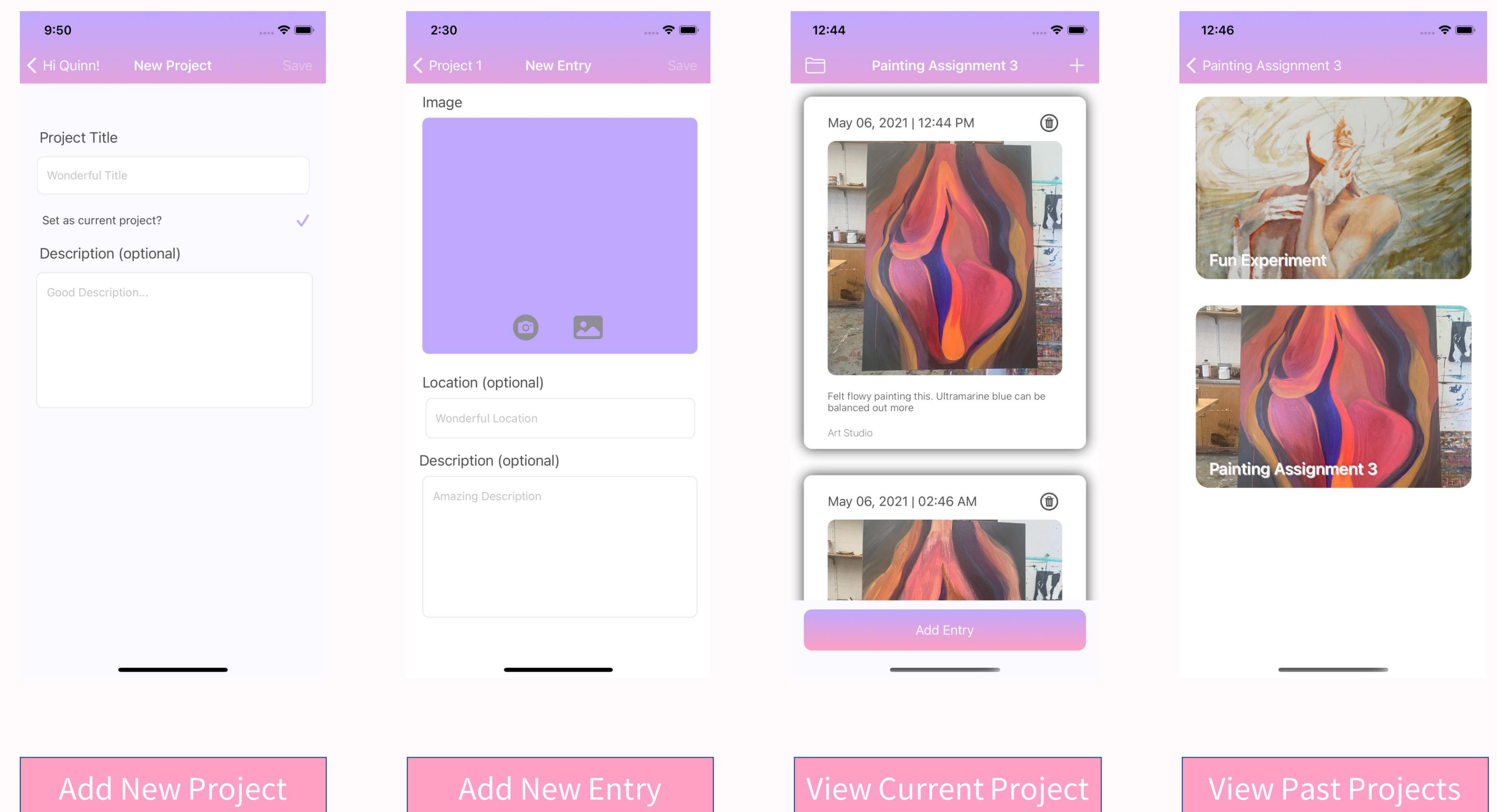
ArtFlow enables users to:

- Capture or upload multiple photos of the WIP for an art project
- Add notes along with the uploaded photos to record thoughts and reflections
- View past art projects
- Continue to work on a past project if desired

Significance

- Provides a central storage space for their art projects
- Prioritizes the importance of an explorative process rather than the end goal
- Serves as a personal space for artists to freely upload whatever they want without external expectations

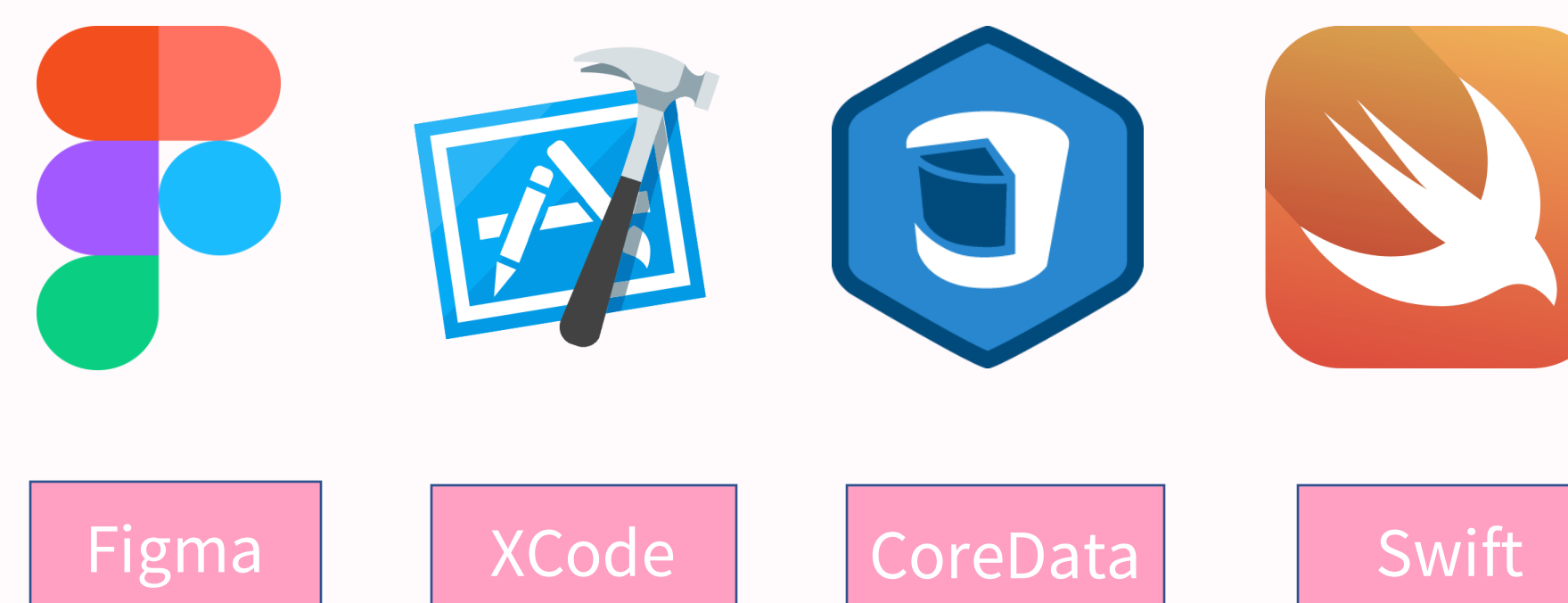
